SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES (11.30am start)

As a club we are aware of the lack of classes at many shows, which in turn hinders many of our judges to reach the required amount of 'hands on' experience to enable them to progress through our judging lists. We have liaised with the Kennel Club and decided to offer 'Special Awards Classes' at our shows and thank exhibitors for supporting this idea.

N.B. These Special Awards are judged as an entirely separate entity from the Open Show and will be judged before the main classes.

A dog beaten in competition for a Special Award is not considered to be a beaten dog for the purposes of Regulations F(1)26 and 27 (Best Puppy in Show and Best in Show).

Visitors to the Show

Visitors are always welcome to any of our events. However, if the event is licensed by The Kennel Club, such as this Open show, please be aware that the Officers and Committee are obliged to make visitors aware of the Rules and Regulations of The Kennel Club.

If unentered dogs are brought in to the show the owner(s) of such dog(s) must sign a declaration stating that the dog(s) is/are fit and healthy to the best of the owner's knowledge.


A fee of £3.00 per dog will be charged.

Photography & Video Rights

The organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography and filming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors.

- It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form of recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the organisers.
- The Bouvier des Flandres Club of G.B. gives permission to anyone who wishes to take general photos at the show. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor.
- The taking of photographs in the show venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the organisers.
- Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites – this is for news purposes only.
- There is no objection to the general public taking photographs of general views of the show provided that these are for private use.
- No photography or filming is permitted within breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after the Best of Sex is awarded.
- Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting the exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or judge is empowered to stop the person concerned.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 11am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging of the Special Award classes starts at 11.30pm with the main show judging at 1pm.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. ENTRY FEES: Members First Entry £5.00. Non-members First Entry £6.00. All subsequent entries £1.00. Special Awards Classes £3.00 as a first entry and £1.00 per class as an entry subsequent to the main show. Not for competition £3.00. Catalogues: Pre-paid £2.50; on the day of the Show £3.00. Entry forms may be downloaded from the website: www.bouvierclub.co.uk or obtained by email from the Secretary on secretary.bdfcofgb@gmail.com
- 6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under four calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. <u>Best Puppy in Show -</u> Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it, may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
 - A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition.
- 11. <u>Best in Show -</u> Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. <u>Best Veteran in Show</u> Best Veteran in Show will be declared from the winners of classes 4 and 12 only.
- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move</u>. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 17. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS
 - Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

18. Not for Competition:

Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 28th February

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but, when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- 1. Withdrawal. The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.
- 2 Transfer.
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or Junior class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

BABY PUPPY A baby puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar

months of age on the first day of the show.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age

on the first day of the show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of

age on the first day of the show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of

age on the first day of the show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of

the show.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or

more first prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether

restricted or not.

LIMIT For dogs which have not won three Challenge

Certificates, under three different judges, or seven or more first prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and

eligible for entry at the Show.
